I have seen the ministry really grow a lot to meet many needs over the past 19 years. Our main focus is still the orphanage, but the clinic helps stop the suffering and dying of the village children. The 2 churches (part of Welcome Home) touch lives and are funded by our Brea (Calif.) church.
