We have had several new children come to join us in the past couple of months. None of their stories of life are easy. We have Sandra abandoned in a maize field. Agnes abandoned by her mother to grandma who cannot look after her, the father's whereabouts unknown. David's mum who is mentally ill abandoned him to grandma who is unable to care for him. Kasim's mother is mentally ill and unable to care for him, father's whereabouts unknown. Please pray for all these little ones as we try to work with them to get a good future. Hulia's mother is a young high school student so probation gave permission for her child to be admitted so she can finish high school and then make a better future for them both.

We have been privileged to take care of Evette and Yvonne while both of their parents were deployed. Dad and mum are both home now and have been able to take their children home.

It is hard to get our hearts ready to say goodbye to the children that are moving onto the next phase of their lives in an older children's home. We care for children from birth to 6 years old so the children pictured above are getting ready to move to SOS children's home in Entebbe. Please pray for them all to have a good future and to do well in school.

Ground has been broken for the next phase of the medical clinic which will house x-ray, dental, prenatal, sterilizing department and laundry, social work, large store room, dining-conference room and outdoor kitchen. NONE of the orphanage support funds that you send in are being used to build the clinic. The clinic extension is funded by an individual donor only.

Thank you for partnering with us. Summer months are always a trial for the orphanage funds and that downturn in giving is already happening. We humbly ask if you can possibly help a little extra financially?
