Our 2 adoptive families (from Canada & Ohio) had a very scary start to their visit to Uganda. On the way from the airport to Jinja they got caught in a riotous roadblock - the shuttlebuslike Taxis were on strike were on strike and strikebreaking Taxi were stopped and destroyed, and their passengers were badly beatup with clubs. The arriving parents were in a vehicle that looked a little like a Taxi, but did not have the specific markings of a Taxi. Fortunately, with a little strenuous negotiation, they were able to drive on without much damage or harm. The Army came in and settled the ruckus.

This stressful event was soon forgotten after they met their children who were well prepared for bonding with their parents. It was a joy to watch the children settle into their new families.

Mandy was blest to hear the report from the local clinic Doctors who feel that our little Emmanuel (who had been so ill last month) is making great progress. It looks as if he has no permanent damage from the serious brain infection.
